



Dr. Janet-Martha Blatny is the Director for the Protection and Societal Security Division at FFI (2014-) and is responsible for the coordination of societal security projects at the Norwegian Defence Research Establishment (FFI). This Division is responsible for the CBRNE and HME (home-made explosives) activities at FFI including threat assessments to provide preventive, response and preparedness measurements related to any kind of incidents, crises or disasters of any cause leading to casualties, disruption and chaos in the civil and military society. Blatny is one of the three Norwegian representatives of the NATO STO HFM Panel (since 2012) and is the Co-Chair of the NATO STO HFM HMP Area. She has coordinated several EDA, EU and NATO projects. Blatny has been a representative of the national preparedness committee in Norway and has acted as chairman at several national/international meetings/conferences with respect to CBRN. She was appointed as one of the national representatives preparing the Norwegian National CBRNE strategy chaired by the Ministry of Justice and Public Security. Blatny has a PhD in Microbial genetics/Biotechnology (1997) from the Norwegian University of Science and Technology (NTNU) Trondheim, Norway. After a post doc at the University of Life Science, Ås, Norway (1998-2003) she started to work as a senior scientist at FFI in 2003. Blatny has, prior to her current position, and as a project manager been responsible for several projects covering biological defence issues, medical countermeasures against chemical warfare agents and soldier health protection at FFI as well as supervising several students (MSc, PhD) and has published in several papers in a wide range of peer reviewed journals.

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
